0-3 Months

Finished size

Length: 14.5cm Circumference: 28cm

Materials

12mm crochet hook 1 x 100g Mighty Stitch Super Bulky from Knit Picks

Abbreviations

MR – magic ring
ch – chain
tr – treble
dc – double crochet
ss – slip stitch
st(s) – stitch(es)
R# - round number

[#] - stitch count for round

<u>Pattern</u>

Form a MR and ch 2.

R1: 10 tr into MR, join to top of 1st tr with a ss and close MR. [10]

R2: ch 2, 2 tr into same st where you joined, 2 tr into each st around, join to 1st tr with a ss. [20]

R3-6: ch 2, tr in same st where you joined and each st around, join to 1st tr with a ss. [20]

R7: ch 1, dc in same st where you joined and each st around, join to 1st dc with a ss. [20]

3-6 Months

Length: 16.5cm Circumference: 36cm

12mm crochet hook 1 x 100g Mighty Stitch Super Bulky from Knit Picks

Abbreviations

MR — magic ring
ch — chain
tr — treble
ss — slip stitch
st(s) — stitch(es)

Pattern

Form a MR and ch 2.

R1: 12 tr into MR, join to top of 1st tr with a ss and close MR. [12]

R2: ch 2, 2 tr into same st where you joined, 2 tr into each st around, join to 1st tr with a ss. [24]

R3-7: ch 2, tr in same st where you joined and each st around, join to 1st tr with a ss. [24]

6-12 Months

Length: 16.5cm Circumference: 40cm

12mm crochet hook 2 x 100g Mighty Stitch Super Bulky from Knit Picks

Abbreviations

MR – magic ring
ch – chain
tr – treble
ss – slip stitch
st(s) – stitch(es)

[#] – stitch count for round

Pattern

Form a MR and ch 2.

R1: 12 tr into MR, join to top of 1st tr with a ss and close MR. [12]

R2: ch 2, 2 tr into same st where you joined, 2 tr into each st around, join to 1st tr with a ss. [24]

R3: ch 2, 2 tr in same st where you joined, 1 tr in next 5 sts, *2 tr in next st, 1 tr in next 5 sts, repeat from * around, join to 1st tr with a ss. [28]

R4-7: ch 2, tr in same st where you joined and each st around, join to 1st tr with a ss. [30]

Toddler

Finished size

Length: 20.5cm Circumference: 42cm

Materials

12mm crochet hook 2 x 100g Mighty Stitch Super Bulky from Knit Picks

Abbreviations

MR – magic ring
ch – chain
tr – treble
ss – slip stitch
st(s) – stitch(es)
R# - round number
[#] – stitch count for round

Pattern

Form a MR and ch 2.

R1: 10 tr into MR, join to top of 1st tr with a ss and close MR. [10]

R2: ch 2, 2 tr into same st where you joined, 2 tr into each st around, join to 1st tr with a ss. [20]

R3: ch 2, 2 tr in same st where you joined, 1 tr in next st, *2 tr in next st, 1 tr in st after, repeat from * around, join to 1st tr with a ss. [30]

R4-9: ch 2, tr in same st where you joined and each st around, join to 1st tr with a ss. [30]

Adult

Finished size

Length: 21cm

Circumference: 49cm

Materials

12mm crochet hook 2 x 100g Mighty Stitch Super Bulky from Knit Picks

Abbreviations

MR - magic ring

ch – chain

tr - treble

ss – slip stitch

st(s) - stitch(es)

R# - round number

[#] - stitch count for round

Pattern

Form a MR and ch 2.

R1: 10 tr into MR, join to top of 1st tr with a ss and close MR. [10]

R2: ch 2, 2 tr into same st where you joined, 2 tr into each st around, join to 1st tr with a ss. [20]

R3: ch 2, 2 tr in same st where you joined, 1 tr in next st, *2 tr in next st, 1 tr in st after, repeat from * around, join to 1st tr with a ss. [30]

R4: ch 2, 2 tr in same st where you joined, 1 tr in next 9 sts, *2 tr in next st, 1 tr in next 9 sts, repeat from * once more, join to 1st tr with a ss [33]

R5-9: ch 2, tr in same st where you joined and each st around, join to 1st tr with a ss. [33]

Notes

- Beanies look great when finished with a large fluffy pom pom as shown on front page
- These can be purchased pre-made online or can be handmade using faux-fur
- Alternatively, a handmade wool pom pom looks great too
- To weave in ends it is easier to use a smaller crochet hook, I used a 6.5mm, as the wool is too thick to try and find a needle with a large enough eye to thread through.
